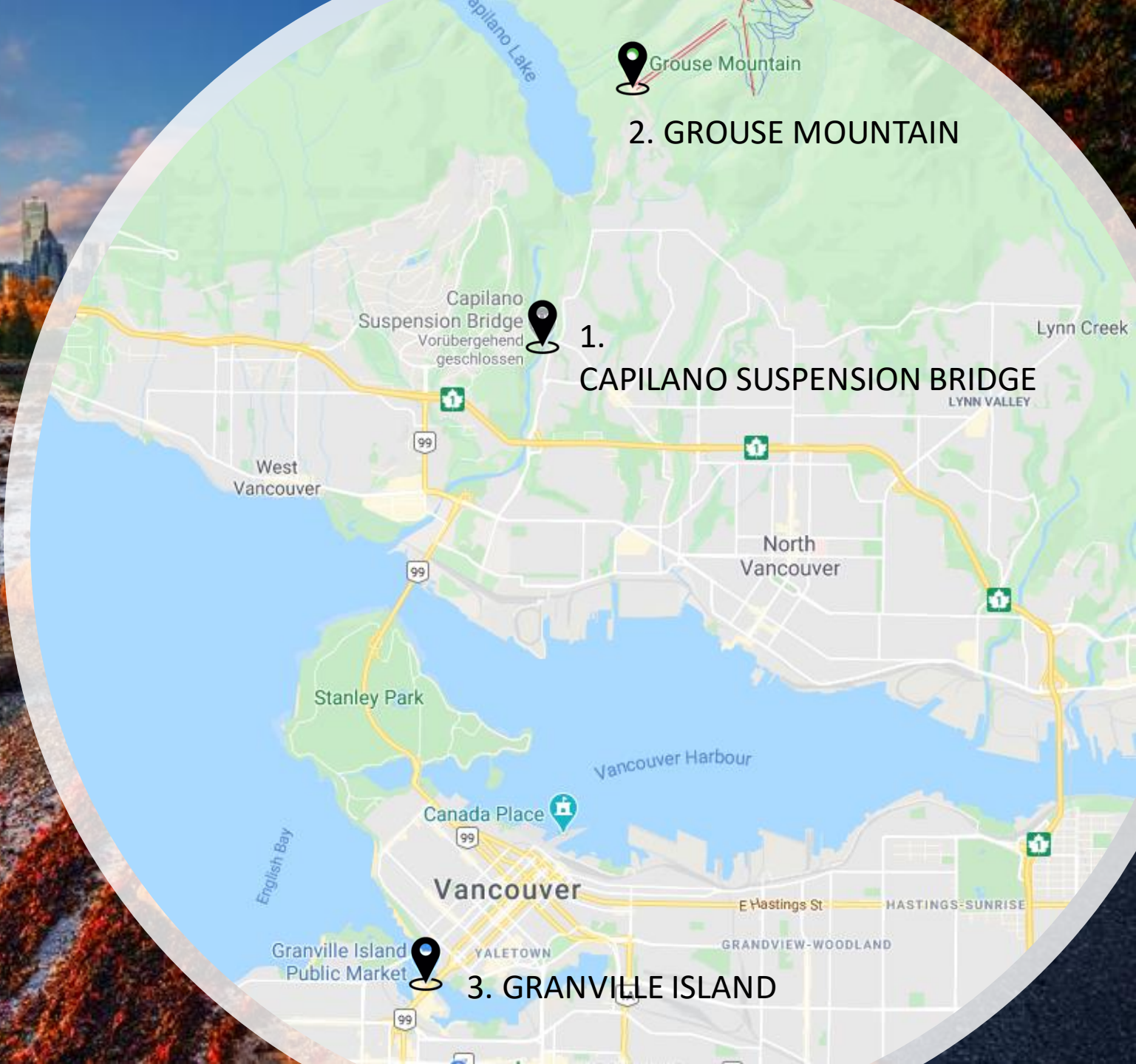

Explanation:

GROUSE MOUNTAIN

Grouse Mountain is one of the North Shore Mountains of the Pacific Ranges in the District Municipality of North Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. With a maximum elevation of over 1,200 m (4,100 feet) at its peak, the mountain is the site of an alpine ski area, Grouse Mountain Resort, which overlooks Greater Vancouver has four chairlifts servicing 33 runs. In the summer, Grouse Mountain Resort features lumberjack shows, the "Birds in Motion" birds of prey demonstration, a scenic chairlift ride, disc Golf, mountain biking, zip lining, tandem paragliding, helicopter tours, and guided ecowalks. Year-round operations include a 100-seat mountaintop theatre and a wildlife refuge. The mountain operates two aerial tramways, known officially as the Skyride. The Blue Skyride is used mainly for freight transportation, while public access to the mountain top is provided by the Swiss-built Garaventa Red Skyride, which has a maximum capacity of 101 passengers (96 in summer). Summer access is also provided by the 2.9 kilometre Grouse Grind hiking trail, which is open for hiking from May to October.

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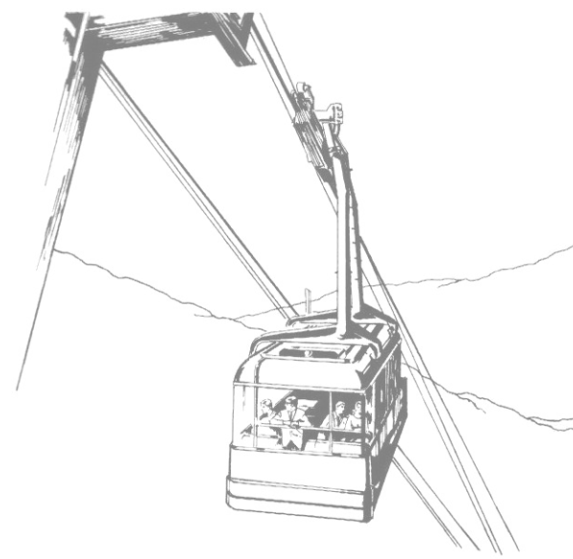
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GROUSE MOUNTAIN

At the beginning we start from the parking lot with the Skyride to the mountain station and from there we have several options.

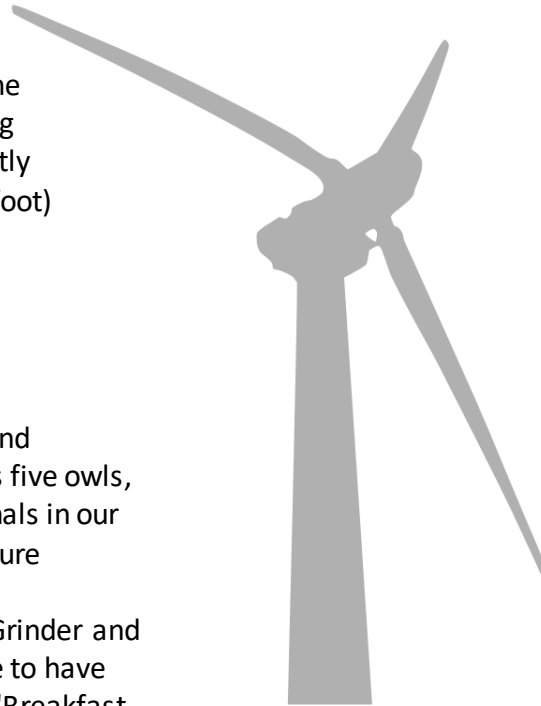
Skyride

The Skyride marks the beginning of any Grouse Mountain experience, taking visitors up to the Alpine Station right next to the Peak Chalet, in just 8 minutes. In the Summertime, Grouse Mountain offer the Skyride Surf Adventure. Feel the wind on your face as you travel 1,610m on the rooftop of the Grouse Mountain Super Skyride!

From two sandbars to the island



Before There Was an Island

What is now Granville Island was once nothing more than two sandbars, that would appear and disappear with the tide. The area was inhabited seasonally by indigenous people, who would use the sandbars for fishing, catching shellfish and gatherings. Eventually, a permanent village was created near the sandbars, called *Señákw* in *Skw̓wxwú7mesh* (Squamish language), or *səháʔqʷ* in *háíqəmiñəm* (Musqueam language). In 1869 a small reserve was created in False Creek, east of the sandbars, and in by 1899, residents were being forced to leave the area completely.



Explanation:

Granville Island is a peninsula and shopping district in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. It is located across False Creek from Downtown Vancouver under the south end of the Granville Street Bridge. The peninsula was once an industrial manufacturing area, but today it is a hotspot for Vancouver tourism and entertainment. The area was named after Granville Leveson-Gower, 2nd Earl Granville.

The island is home to **275 businesses** and facilities that employ more than **2,500 people** and generates more than **\$215-million** in economic activity each year.

Granville Island provides amenities such as a large public market, an extensive marina, a hotel, Arts Umbrella, False Creek Community Centre, various performing arts theatres including Vancouver's only professional improvisational theatre company Vancouver Theatresports League, the Arts Club Theatre Company and Carousel Theatre, fine arts galleries, and variety of shopping areas.

The Granville Island Public Market features a farmers' market, day vendors, and artists offering local Vancouver goods. There are 50 permanent retailers and typically more than one-hundred day vendors in stalls throughout the market selling a variety of artisan cottage-industry foods and handmade crafts on a rotating schedule. This location was used in the finale of the film *Mission: Impossible – Ghost Protocol* (2011).

Granville Island Brewing Co. is also the name of a beer company which originated on Granville Island in 1984, but whose main base of operations was moved to Kelowna, British Columbia some time later. In 2009 it was purchased by Molson's Brewery and continues to brew small batches of its varieties at the Granville Island brewing original site, and offers beer tasting and tours of their brewing facilities.

Ocean Concrete is the longest-established tenant on the island, having set up shop there in 1917. In 2014, OSGEMEOS (Portuguese for THE TWINS), consisting of brother duo Gustavo and Otavio Pandolfo, revamped the concrete silos with their ongoing mural project, 'Giants'.

Granville Island is the central location of several annual festivals, including the Vancouver International Children's Festival, the Vancouver Fringe Festival, and the Vancouver Writers Fest.

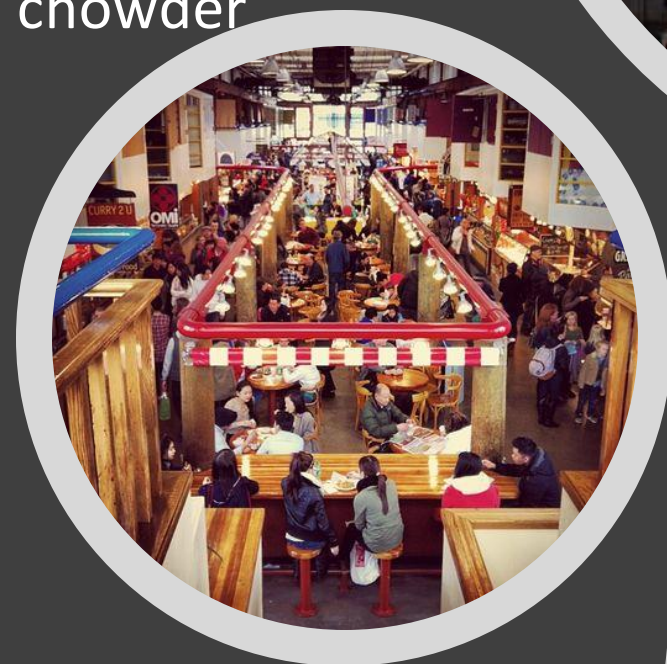

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Summary

Capilano Suspension Bridge Park

- **Suspension Bridge**

The first hemp version of Capilano Suspension Bridge was built in 1889. Since then it's been replaced a number of times, and stretches 137 metres (450 feet) across, at 70 metres (230 feet) above Capilano River

- **Cliffwalk**

With only 16 anchor points in the granite cliff supporting the structure, Cliffwalk is both environmentally sensitive and adrenaline- pumping!

- **Treetops Adventure**

Putting you over 30 metres (100 feet) into the tree canopy, Treetops Adventure offers a squirrel's eye view of the thriving coastal rainforest in the mid-story of 1,300-year-old Douglas fir trees.

Despite being home to 300 businesses, studios and facilities, the destination still retains an old-fashioned, timeless feeling. Craftsmen and artists take up residence here, and it's clear that the tradition of apprenticeship and mastery is alive and well. You can see it in the detail of a ceramic bowl or the gentle curve of a freshly blown glass vase, the intricacy of a piece of jewellery or the flick of a painter's brush. Still, the influx of artists is a relatively new occurrence.


Conclusion
